Next Steps: Survey members and affiliates to find out what is already occurring around lethal means access. Outreach and Awareness reach out to the coalitions around the state. Organize a small group to work on this. Refine priorities around lethal mean access for the revised YSIPP. This refers to: Goal 5. Promote efforts to address means safety among individuals with identified suicide risk. Objective 5.1: Gather information needed to implement means safety programs as research becomes available. 5.1.a. By March 2018, the Alliance will oversee a strategic plan for developing, implementing and evaluating means safety counseling and



			other programs that are research-informed, culturally relevant and respectful of community values. Discussion: This may be an opportunity to refine and clarify the goal and the role of the Alliance. Context includes broad range of differing opinions , discussion during development of the YSIPP. There was some legislation that did not pass this last session related to gun access. If there is future legislation re lethal means access, include variety of types of means used for suicide. Email: Who is interested in participating in a workgroup and also asking about current engagement with lethal means access. Also, follow up with the coalitions.
8:45	Legislation	Legislative Round Up and Next Steps	The legislature closed yesterday. We need to follow up to ensure that the POP passed through at \$10million level. The POP included the items outlined in the PowerPoint presented to the Alliance by Ann Kirkwood before she left. Short Session is coming up. David asks if there is anything that the Alliance wants to work on this session. Note in a short session, need to focus on a more narrow/focused ask. Jerry/Julie are meeting with Rep. Keny-Guyer to follow up on HB2023 and 3090 regarding the type of follow up needed to monitor implementation of these bills. Jerry will be advocating for a legislative workgroup to look at continuing education issue. David notes that Sen Fredericks office also expressed interest in organizing a workgroup. This strategy worked well with HB3091 which had a lot of opposition and were able to demonstrate all the efforts to bring people together from a variety of sectors. Ryan notes that the CEU issue is also a high priority for AFSP and that AFSP could actively engage with this effort—and Ryan believes that there needs to be a clear message that as a field we are going to continue to push forward on this issue.



			Laura Rose asks: We know some of the trades that have higher suicide risks. Can we identify those that especially affect youth.
			David has a resource in the construction industry. Ryan notes that first responders also could be powerful advocates for the need of a trained workforce to respond and treat.
			David asks the Executive Committee: If the Alliance doesn't focus on continuing education, is there another policy that might be achievable in the short session.
