			707, funding for training, staffing (OHA and
			Alliance) increased awareness/interest in
			suicide prevention, SB52, etc.),
			Don – there has been an intense focus on
			investment; we need to make the case for a
			big return on small investment re: suicide
			prevention. This is not a time to retreat –
			the current environment points to potential
			increase in suicide due to the pressures
			and risk people are experiencing.
			Jill – it is interesting that law makers who in
			the past may not have focused on suicide
			prevention are now interested. Currently



there is no mandate for an adult suicide prevention plan like there is for youth.

John – other states have plans that focus suicide prevention across the life span. It is important for OR not to lose the youth focus.

Debra - is researching plans from other states and how they are set up (single plan across lifespan or separate for adult and youth but integrated).

Action: Debra will summarize her findings and send to David, Galli and Annette for circulation.

David – add a legislative recommendation that OHA have an adult suicide prevention plan similar to the YSIPP. Have accountability built into the plan and a strong collaborative tie to the youth plan but not necessarily an integrated plan.

Ryan – suggested the addition of promoting an adult plan be added to the policy agenda under "explore" category.
