Stakeholder Feedback: Alliance Quarterly

- UO Suicide Prevention Lab and Alliance staff helped facilitate breakout focus groups based on seven sectors for YSIPP 2.0 input
 - K-12 Education
 - Higher Education
 - Communications and Media
 - Physical Healthcare
 - Behavioral Healthcare
 - Child Welfare
 - Faith-Based and Religious Org
- Groups were composed of 4-7 participants along with a facilitator and notetaker.
 - Participation across groups was active
 - Feedback on the experience was overall positive

Focus Group Questions



- UO team developed three guiding questions in collaboration with Alliance staff:
 1. **What are 1-2 things going well in suicide prevention efforts in [this sector] in Oregon?**
 2. **What are the main issues related to youth suicide in [this sector] in Oregon?**
 3. **What do you see as the 1-2 most important things that need to happen in [this sector] in Oregon?**
- Questions followed a logical thought pattern of a) what is already going well, b) what are the major roadblocks still in place, and c) what are some solutions?

Focus Group Initial Findings

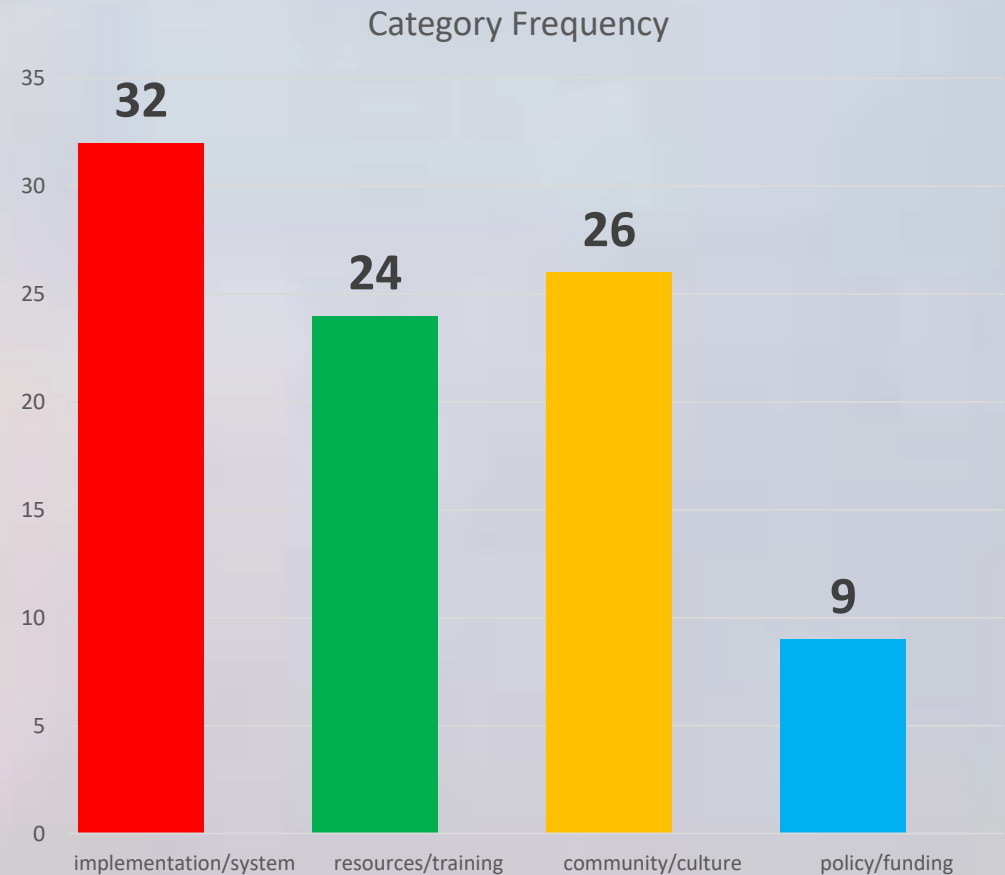
- UO began the qualitative process of coding focus group notes.
- Four domain categories were identified spanning across all questions and sectors.
- Additionally, cross-sector themes were identified and organized by question

Domain categories that feedback was organized by:

- 1. Implementation/systems**
- 2. Resources/training**
- 3. Community/culture**
- 4. Policy/Funding**

Domain Categories Findings

- Chart shows frequency of categories mentioned across all sectors and questions
- Discussion of category topics was fairly even excluding policy/funding (which was least discussed)
- Future analysis will look at within sector and question frequencies
 - However, overall count gives good indication of what participants were focused on



Cross-Sector Themes: Going Well

- Almost all sectors pointed to a dramatic increase in awareness of issue and resources
- Low and no-cost trainings have increased across almost all sectors
- Changes in state and local policy and funding have had a positive effect

**Above three are all connected (policy > increase in funding > trainings/awareness)*



Cross-Sector Themes: Major Issues



- The prevalence of stigma was emphasized across almost all sectors
- Insufficient support and ineffective implementation around policies and programming was a major issue
- Although training and knowledge has increased, still need for more across all sectors
- Inequities around at-risk populations and the services they receive

Cross-Sector Themes: Suggested Solutions

- Connecting stakeholders, practitioners, and community members through networks and collaboration
- Changing the culture around mental health and suicide prevention so that stigma is reduced
- More trainings that are implemented with high quality
- Improve suicide prevention policies, procedures, and programming at the state and local level



Cross-Sector Themes: Suggested Solutions Cont.

- Implementation supports that support practitioners and translate policy into practice
- Shift to a lifespan perspective
- Revision and improvement of existing plans that incorporate stakeholder voices and effective strategies



Next Steps

- Continue qualitative analysis and coding
 - Analyze feedback within sectors and within questions
 - Generate frequency charts based on above findings
- Create summary draft for feedback (end of October)
- Distribute final report to Alliance members and partners (beginning of November)
