This allows OHA to have another funded position which doubles the staffing they have available within the Public Health Division to work on Suicide Prevention. Meghan
		Position focuses on adult 25+ looking at how zero suicide can be embedded across lifespan. Public health SPC position closed before Thanksgiving and will start interviews for this position next week. No clear timeline for when they will start. ### **OHA Update**

- 1. There is a Bill Analysis training that Jill took through OHA that describes the legislative process and understanding how to read/understand bills. Once they email me the PowerPoint. I'll send it out to the Exec through Jenn. Its really helpful and well done.
- 2. HB 3090 update: the OHA suicide prevention, intervention and postvention team (SPIP) is working on resources for Emergency Department directors to help support Caring Contact policies. We will vet through the Trans. Of Care Committee on the Alliance. Sample questions and methodology for the re-survey of hospitals regarding HB 3090 should be released soon by OHA to stakeholders (including designated Alliance members) for input.
- 3. Jill and Shanda are working on adding Elementary Programming for suicide prevention before the end of this biennium with limited funding. Stay tuned.
- 4. The OHA Suicide Prevention team is growing by one in Public Health. Interviews for Meghan's old job as the Garrett Lee Smith grant coordinator are happening in December. This will mean there are two youth suicide prevention coordinators (Jill and Shanda), one adult coordinator (Deb), a Zero Suicide in Healthcare coordinator (Meghan) and a GLS grant coordinator (To be hired). We have also gotten some FTE dedicated to our team in the data realm of Public Health. All of these things make us stronger and will allow for us to make more progress in this work.
