- SB 48 letter was sent to OHA and presented as a supporting document to House Behavioral Health Committee during December Legislative Days.
- Lines for Life LC Talking Points
 - 1) We are seeing youth younger than 10 die of suicide
 - 2) Data drives decision making around where to provide resources and currently the state does not report on suicides under the age of 10
 - 3) Understanding the risk factors involved in suicide under the age of 10 allows us to target prevention efforts as far upstream as possible
