We feel like group norms will help dissolve the youth and adult separation and power dynamic as well as hold us accountable . We will be able to look back at the group norms we create from this activity to

better understand who is responsible for upholding our values and ensure that youth continue to feel engaged throughout the meeting and not just during the update.
And that youth feel validated for their voice in settings like this one that are predominantly adult centered.
We want youth in this space to feel like leaders and that we are needed and wanted opposed to tokenized and not important to this work.
I also wanted to add that we feel like this will help move us on from the conversation around boys in youth leadership so youth can share in these meetings with a common understanding among the adult members that we voted for these youth to use their voice and tackle equity work and suicide prevention from the youth perspective.

The question that was raised during the quarterly meeting, "Why aren't there any guys / boys in leadership?" How do we bring in new members to this space? Like youth / young adults that are not involved in YYEA.
