	Notes about Alliance priorities in relation to the YSIPP: - Every exec meeting we should be able to tell how we can make progress - Only macro consideration for YSIPP is the relationship to consideration for Youth Services in the 988 planning. It means a very deliberate dovetailing. - leveraging our own perspectives and sharing our achievements and objectives would be very helpful. - Fundamental focus has to include what 988 hopes to accomplish on the next 5 years. We need to attend to the broader context as well as the YSIPP - Equity work in particular and youth leadership piece should not be a separate thing, it should surround all the other things on this list - are there any youth involved in the 988 work? - OHA is pulling together two new subgroups that will guide 988 including an equity subgroup and lived experience subgroup.
