8:40	Five Radical Minutes, Darci Brown and Liz Thorne		<p>Liz-With Sources and Five Radical Minutes – our approach is to shore up what people are already doing, to walk alongside teachers and schools to think through how this integrates or supports other SEL programming</p> <p>Darci Brown – new member of the Sources/Matchstick Team.</p> <p>Five Radical Minutes: Comprehensive, teacher led prompt. Scripted and thematic with new topics each week. The intention is that there is low-prep, with simply accessible prompts. The goal is to build the classroom culture and connection.</p> <p>Ask: Can you help us with how to get the word out to schools and help us with strategies for that?</p> <p>In terms of the Good Behavior Game, too expensive to implement statewide so has not yet been a priority to fund.</p> <p>Shanda: Darci will be helping to onboard funded programs and also will have a role in helping OHA to identify other elementary school programs.</p>
