The work was advertised in AFSP newsletters.</p> <p>HB 2980 passed this session! Thank you, Laura Rose, for your continued work on this piece of legislation. Oregon will join the 14 other states that have Peer Respite and will be one of the national leaders having our Legislature approve 4 locations – Southern Oregon, Central or Eastern Oregon, Portland metro area, and the Oregon coast.</p> <p>Laura Rose shared that youth and family voice are currently informing OHA’s workplan and are providing feedback on the Vision Paper for the Child and Family Behavioral Health Unit. This work</p>

			<p>include the topic of respite.</p> <p>Dan brought up the large number of mass grave sites that are being unearthed and encouraged us to reach out to our Native friends who may be having a more difficult time right now.</p> <p>Gordon encouraged us to remember that indigenous women go missing and experience violence at a very high rate.</p> <p>Nikobi reminded us that July is minority mental health awareness month. This month is the anniversary of the protests that occurred last year in Portland.</p> <p>Kimberlee discussed Spanish Suicide Prevention training and how only QPR has a specific module / training in Spanish. However, we have a large population of only Spanish speaking folks or speak English as a second language and we need to have more resources for them around suicide prevention. This is a huge gap in our services that deserves more attention.</p> <p>Shanda recently attended a wrap-up meeting for LGBTQ+ mini-grants and was beautifully led by Kris Bifulco and the AOCHP Team. Go here for a reminder of what these mini-grants were about. Many shared that receiving the mini-grants allowed them to</p>
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			<p>access additional funding to continue the great work they are doing and built amazing and strong partnerships. While AOCMHP staffed the project, the LGBTQ+ Advisory Group was the main driving force behind the process and selection of organizations.</p>
