		BIPOC Caucus for Alliance members: Doodle will be sent out to Alliance folks to schedule this. There will then be an Equity Steering Committee meeting and UPRISE will send us their report towards the end of February. Annette received a request after the December Quarterly to continue the discussion around white saviorism and white supremacy. Jesus Nunez-Pineda is doing an internship with the Alliance to help move the equity work forward.
		Jill is back! YSIPP publication happened a couple weeks ago. Congrats to everyone on that huge team effort. Reminder: not a 5-year sits on the shelf plan. It's a living breathing document that can be adjusted as we go and needs change. Annual reports for this will be formatted similarly to the new YSIPP format moving forward. The first annual report will be published March 2022 looking at activities from 2021 and the data from CDC will be published.
		Laura Rose was informed that support for PeerGalaxy.com Calendar and Community will continue for 2022. We reached 4 Million Hits, 69 Thousand hours of offerings incl. peer support, some directly related to suicide prevention.
		HB 2315 (Behavioral Health provider CEU) goes into effect July 1, 2022. OHA completed an investigative process looking at licensee's included in the legislation. Next steps will happen soonish – this is on Jill's to-do list and will be worked on now that she is

		<ul> <li>PowerPoint with each policy option: Annette describes process that got us here and orient to the materials they reviewed. We will discuss each item for a sense of the group – does this stay or go? We will have a real time poll available for each option to get a sense of the group and then take time for discussion and determining if it should be forward to the full Alliance for a vote.</li> <li>Options are: 1) Forward to POP (In Zoom Poll)</li> <li>2) Consider for other longterm policy work or next legislative session.</li> <li>3) Great idea—not a priority for us.</li> <li>4)Some other group is more well suited to advocate for this.</li> </ul>
		Once determined which will forward to the POP, ask the group if they have strong feelings about the highest priorities. OHA and staff can participate in the discussion but not vote. Next step will be for Galli, Ryan, Annette, and Jenn to prioritize options and send to full Alliance for vote January 20 <sup>th</sup> from 2:00 PM – 3:00 PM.

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		<ul> <li>said not an Alliance priority</li> <li>988: 7 voted to include in POP to OHA, 2 voted to have for long-term policy option</li> <li>Workforce, HB 2315: 9 voted to include in POP to OHA, 1 voted to have for long-term policy option</li> <li>Fund ASIPP / Lifespan Approach: 8 voted to include in POP to OHA, 1 voted to consider for long-term policy option</li> <li>Coalition Grants: 6 voted to include in POP to OHA, 1 voted to consider for long-term policy option</li> <li>Lethal Means: 2 voted to include in POP to OHA, 5 voted to consider for long-term policy option, 2 voted to consider for long-term policy option, 2 voted that a different group would be more suited to take on this work</li> <li>It was voted that the following POP ideas be sent to the full Alliance membership for an official vote: 988 funding, Workforce HB 2315, Fund the ASIPP, and Coalition Grants.
