By-laws ask for committee members to appoint their chairs so a vote will take place during the September meeting. If anyone else wants to submit their name to be considered for a co-chair role, please send that to Jenn.</p> <p>Executive update: Alliance staff has a project tracker that lists all YSIPP Initiatives assigned to the Alliance</p> <p>SSPW Update: - Team connected this week to plan and identify challenges. - Recently completed an Adi's Act landscape scan to see who has plans shared on their website as required. There will be a published report that comes out in the future and will be shared with ODE, OHA, this group, U of O Team, and the School Safety Task Force.</p>

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- Preliminary Results: Scanned 190 districts (out of 197) and 51 have plans listed online. Doing full reviews of plans to see what Adi's Act requires, what curriculum / Big River programs are coming up, and more.
- The future report will have lots of good information for advocacy efforts and figuring out next steps.
- Can schools get the results? This was the original request however, after talking with ODE and thinking from the suicide prevention lens, it was decided to not share with schools as it's a scan and for public release. If you want to talk with Claire or her team about the report and how it relates to your school, reach out to her.

Changed their free tier options where they only keep the last 6-months of work. Allows for multiple threads of conversation and if you aren't part of any specific thread, you can still see other discussions that are happening. - Monday.Com is another one that also integrates with Google Docs - Meta Workplace – you receive email notifications when people post (which can be adjusted as needed). National organization and user friendly / easy to communicate on. Cost is unknown.
