		 When it's time, Jill asked us to think through the YSIPP Initiatives for FY 22-23 that this group is interested in amplifying and how we can map out the pieces for those and the potential CME legislation to come together. Map what already exists (trainings hospitals are doing. Jill knows someone who is a nurse whose hospital does a suicide prevention training and Charlette Lumby knows of efforts in the Salem Hospital she is / was part of) What could be our implementation strategy for mapping out what exists? Investigating the pros/cons of going after workforce initial training requirements rather than continuing education. Social work, counseling prep programs. CACREP requirement, etc.

		 Rep. Nosse will be the chair of the House Healthcare Committee. There is talk of combining the Healthcare and Behavioral Health Committees this next legislative session. Nosse is a big champion of Behavioral Health legislation. Don is interested in having a conversation with Rep. Nosse around the CME expansion legislation. He may have some insight between the overlap of healthcare / behavioral healthcare worlds. Asking things like, "How might we approach this issue in the legislature?" Don will send a request to Rep. Nosse and will work with Annette, Julie, and Jenn around crafting that email. Jenn will start this email chain. Another notice for a new public hearing will be sent out. 988/MRSS rules and the 5 definitions that have huge impact on scope of work and overlap with those rules and HB 2315 will be done at the same time so there won't be any contradictions. This slows the process but is okay. Internal meeting September 8th. What can we do? Pull out trainings listed in 988/MRSS and definitions so we can review them and provide input during the public hearing / comment period.
