Questions about priority area 2:

- Have people from different schools talk to us: what percentage of students do you see using substances in schools, what substances are you seeing?
- What are schools currently doing around substance prevention?
- What is the current prevalence of Flunitrazepam (Rohypnol) in schools? Curry county saw usage of this pre-pandemic.
- How are schools currently responding when drugs are found on students? Just punishment / suspension or expulsion or other things? School Resource Officer (SRO) referrals?

Ideas for priority area 2:

- Look outside of Oregon as well. What is the national landscape? How have family conversations around substances changed? What are the available tools for parents and schools?

Resources to address priority area 2:

- RAP Card that Gordon made around Flunitrazepam (Rohypnol) use.

36 issues kids have to worry about and how parents can talk to them about it.

1. Work with Oregon Firearm Safety Coalition to create best practice / FAQ around ORS 166.435 to send to Attorney General and the Oregon Governor's Office from the Alliance asking for clarification, guidance, approval of it.

Donna-Marie says this is a priority for her in the firearm world. Oregon Firearm Safety Coalition is also working on this and they could use support from the Alliance.

Has two projects: Letter to Attorney General and creation of FAQ

2. Support efforts on LC 3138 which has not been assigned a bill number yet

This would help with #1 but has not yet moved forward in the legislative process. If it is assigned a bill number, this would be coupled with priority 1. If the bill goes through, there will be natural clarification for ORS 166.435. [Legislative calendar](#) for legislative bill deadlines.

3. Directory / map of gun shops that provide off-site storage for firearms

Donna-Marie has already started this with a Google Form

4. Postvention for overdose / all deaths

Take idea of prevention upstream – who has contact with parents, pediatricians, how do we normalize that a child is having troubles before it gets to them self-medicating, etc.
