Senator Hayden had questions about two sections in the bill: <ul> <li>Must have a six-hour training is listed on one place but another place in the bill says may have a six-hour training.</li> <li>Annette is working with OHA Government Relations and she believes the legislation may receive an amendment.</li> </ul> </li> </ul>
9:50	Review New SB 48 Report, now called Suicide prevention training for medical and behavioral health providers	See report and PowerPoint attached in meeting materials along with an executive summaryGordon likes proposals #4 and #6 in the full report.Stephanie asked who added the don't know / unsure question in the survey. Meghan isn't sure. Jill put the report together and she will ask her. Marielena worries that taking out this question may give us false data. There is a chance that some people don't remember the training that they took for a variety of reasons – it wasn't impactful for them, they have so many other trainings, etc. We could leave it but add an option of I don't remember or something.

		Gordon asks if there are any consequences for those who don't complete the HB 2315 requirement – do their licenses not get renewed? Annette says it's up to the boards.
		Stephanie shared her experience with her licensing board about the pain training requirement. When she renews her license, she is asked if she has taken a pain training and they rely on her honesty. Boards randomly audit licensees and ask for proof of trainings they completed. If people don't have the proof, they are put on probation and given a timeframe to complete the training.
		Naturopaths are considered primary care providers (PCPs) as far as insurance goes. Stephanie notes that naturopaths spend a log of time with each Client, longer than traditional PCPs do.
		Annette asked Meghan if there is any route for us to take to have the report be more in depth and ask the boards for more. Meghan isn't sure but can follow-up with Jill / let her know we asked the question.
		Annette will write some comments from this discussion about the new report, run them past this committee, and then submit it to the Executive Committee for approval to send to OHA.
