			 Comments/Thoughts: We should look deeper into post-acute COVID and suicidality. Researcher at OHSU is looking at that. Data from CDC is heteronormative. We should get deeper into other demographics: rural vs urban (important for Oregon). We can't rely only on national data to make decisions about Oregon. In Oregon, each county's medical examiners track suicide death data differently – so even in Oregon, data isn't uniform More information on collecting REALD & SOGI data in Oregon: https://www.oregon.gov/oha/ei/pages/demographics.aspx Data justice act was passed in 2021 and it has taken some years to get it in place.
