Address recommendations in the 2023 Schools Committee "Purple Paper", the Alliance will determine how suicide prevention, intervention and postvention programs are evaluating implementation effectiveness and focusing on supports for youth and youth-serving staff in prekindergarten through college and university levels, with an emphasis on populations of increased relative risk (i.e. youth of color, LGBTQ+, and youth with disabilities).

- Partnerships with state higher ed officers, JED foundation
- Asking programs to share their self- evaluation methods and core metrics (who they say they serve, who they actually train, follow-ups, etc.)
