	c. Create or review Logic Model that guides evaluation of YSIPP
	(requested by the Alliance to inform their advising and monitoring role)
	 Annette: Do we want to wait for the new YSIPP or even do
	some advising around the creation of the new YSIPP?
	Roger: OHA has created an internal system to track the Big Pivor trainings in a variety of different ways. They will use the
	River trainings in a variety of different ways. They will use the database in collaboration w/UofO for evaluation purposes.
	 John: It is hard to create an overarching logic model for the
	YSIPP given the number of initiatives. Perhaps we need



some nested logic models, incl 1 for the Big River Initiative. We want to capture the process and not just the impact.

- What has been used so far? UO has a guide for the Big River Initiative and will ideally be accessing the OHA data repository to see if there is an impact that is appearing through other mechanisms, such as the Student Health Survey.
- Annette would like to defer to the evaluators for decisions around what a logic model would look like. It would ideally include a theory of change.
- Annette: Now that the Alliance is no longer doing Advocacy, the monitoring role takes on heightened significance.
- John: We need to understand facilitators and barriers to the implementation as process measures.
- Annette: We have a recommendation to OHA that there be funding from the legislature for funding SP across the lifespan. The last time it was presented to the legislature, there was a walk out and it didn't happen. It is worth a discussion with the Executive Committee. Jill at OHA wants to be sure that children and families don't get left behind if attention moves toward lifespan.
- Roger: OHA has also been discussing creating a logic model for the YSIPP.
- Karen shared the one-page logic model for OHA's SP grant, which has many strategies and includes intermediate outputs and outcomes and long-term outcomes. It follows the CDC format. A better version might include info on risk and protective factors as a way to show the logic of chosen strategies and expected impacts on those factors.
- d. Advising other committees, as requested
 - All committee chairs attend Alliance Executive Committee mtgs. We can remind other committees of our role during



those meetings and see if anyone has questions or TA requests. e. Keep current on suicide-related data projects
