Subcommittee Decision Making: A quorum is defined as three voting members of the Alliance, and must include a Subcommittee Chair or Co-chair. Decisions will be made by majority vote of the total number of members on that Subcommittee that are present. Any member may submit motions for vote to the Subcommittee and at quarterly meetings.

Main Objective of Meeting: The meeting focused on suicide prevention and gun safety measures, with discussions around the effectiveness of safe storage devices and tracking their impact on reducing suicide rates. The group explored policy recommendations for Extreme Risk Protection Orders and firearm storage initiatives, while also discussing the importance of education and secure storage for firearm safety. Updates were shared on various initiatives including cannabis work, medication disposal methods, and the distribution of secure storage devices, with the team agreeing to pursue several action items including an alliance project on cannabis education for teens.

Agenda Item: Policy Recommendation Language

Notes: The team explored challenges in tracking the impact of safe storage devices distributed across Oregon, with Lucina and Meghan explaining that while they track device distribution, linking individual usage to suicide prevention outcomes would be difficult due to privacy concerns and the widespread distribution of devices.

Starting Language:

Support and expand training on Extreme Risk Protection Orders (ERPOs) for law enforcement officials. Trainings on ERPOs including how to request one, what an ERPO covers, and other logistics should also be made available to the public. Final Language:

OHA to work with the Judicial branch to support and expand training on Extreme Risk Protection Orders (ERPOs) for law enforcement officials and relevant court systems staff. Trainings on ERPOs would include how to request one, what an ERPO covers, and other logistics. Trainings should also be made available to the public.

Starting Language:

Provide off-site storage for firearms in times of crisis at FFLs. Offer a waiver / voucher system for people to access safe storage for free or low cost to increase accessibility and lower barriers in times of crisis.

New Language:

Provide off-site storage for firearms in times of crisis at Federally Firearm Licensee (FFLs). Offer a waiver / voucher system for people to access safe storage for free or low cost to increase accessibility and lower barriers in times of crisis.

 Alliance Lethal Means Safety Subcommittee to put together recommendations regarding education for OHA to share why it is so important to support a program like this.
